Dear Mr. Picente:

Capital Account H-274 (Transit Modernization, Phase III) was established for various federal and state funded transit capital projects. This account facilitates the purchase of different kinds of vehicles as well as the purchase of various equipment related to public transportation in Oneida County.

Recently, Oneida County received notification from the New York State Department of Transportation, that its application for additional capital investment assistance under Federal Transit Administration Section 5311 was awarded. The approved grant includes the purchase of four (4) buses for Oneida County Rural Transit service, provided by the Birnie Bus Tours. An amendment resolution to the capital account is now necessary to accommodate the additional allocation of \$300,000 (Federal 80% - \$240,000; NYS DOT 10% -\$30,000 and local 10% -\$30,000) for the capital items. It is important to note, that the purchase of the new capital items will be at no cost to the County, because the required local match will be provided by Birnie Bus Tours Inc. as it's stated in their letter from 12/14/2006.

I request that you recommend to the Board of Legislators for its consideration and approval the attached amendment to Capital Project H-274 – Transit Modernization Phase III in the amount of \$300,000 additional dollars.

The New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) recently approved the Oneida County Section 5311 Capital Investment Grant application for a rural and nonurbanized transit capital project. The approved project is for the purchase of four (4) buses and bus related equipment, to replace two 2000 and two 2002 buses, which are approaching their expected service life.

The total amount approved for this project is \$300,000 (80% Federal, 10% NYS Department of Transportation and 10% local share) total costs. The required local match, which is up to \$30,000, will be paid by the Birnie Bus Tours Inc, the public transportation services provider in the rural areas of Oneida County. There will be no cost to Oneida County in this project.

The Oneida County Board of Legislators, approved filing of the application with its Resolution No. 91 from 03/28/2007.

I request that you recommend to the Board the attached resolution, authorizing the Oneida County Executive to sign the Mass Transportation Capital Project Agreement for the Section 5311 capital project. RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ONEIDA COUNTY EXECUTIVE TO SIGN A MASS TRANSPORTATION CAPITAL PROJECT AGREEMENT WITH NEW YORK STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

Authorizing the implementation, and funding in the first instance of the State Mass Transportation Capital Program aid and the State-administered federal program aid costs, of a transportation federal-aid project, to fully fund the local share of federal-aid eligible and ineligible project costs, and appropriating funds therefore.

- WHEREAS, a Project for the purchase of the four (4) replacement buses for pulic transportation service in rural and non-urbanized areas of the Oneida County, P.I.N. 2796.06.306 (the "Project") is eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S. Code, as amended, that calls for the apportionment of the such costs at 80% Federal funds and 20 % non-federal funds; and
- WHEREAS, the County of Oneida desires to advance the above project by making a commitment of 100% of the federal and non-federal share of the costs of the project.
- WHEREAS, any State matching funds to this Federally-funded project may be used to fund up to 50% of the non-Federal share of federally-funding projects, but not to exceed 10% of the project costs,
- WHEREAS, any Transit State Dedicated Fund aid may not be used to fund the non-Federal share of federally-funding projects,
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Oneida County Board of Legislators, duly convened does hereby
- RESOLVE, that the Oneida County Board of Legislators hereby approves the above-subject project; and it is hereby further
- RESOLVED, that the Oneida County Board of Legislators hereby authorizes the Oneida County Executive to pay in the first instance 100% of the federal and non-federal share of the cost of work for the Project or portions thereof; and it is further
- RESOLVED, that the sum of 300,000 is hereby appropriated from H-274 Transit Modernization Phase III Capital Account] and made available to cover the cost of participation in the above phase of the Project; and it is further

Honorable Members:

As explained in the attached letter from the Oneida County Sheriff, he is requesting a new Deputy Sheriff position (Grade 1S Step 4) at a starting salary of \$33,555. It is anticipated this new hire will start on June 1, 2008 and will attend the police academy for the first three months. In September, after the cadets graduation, the cadet will be used to replace an officer that will be reassigned to a new assignment.

The Holland Patent School District has requested the Sheriffs Department to provide a full time School Resource Officer beginning in September 2008 as a result of an unfortunate but very dangerous event that occurred in the current school year. A more seasoned officer will be assigned to the school district which will create an opening in the Sheriffs Office which will be filled by the above requested new position. The Sheriffs Department and the Holland Patent School System are entering into an agreement which the Holland Patent School System will reimburse Oneida County for cost incurred including salary and fringes. The agreement calls for reimbursement from Holland Patent School System which will be used to offset the cost of the new deputy. The contract with Holland Patent Schools is will run on a year to year basis.

Due to the fact this new position isn't anticipated to be filled until June it is only necessary to fund the position at approximately half its salary and benefits



Honorable Members:

I am in receipt of a letter from Legislator Stephen Roefaro requesting that the Board restore \$32,000 to Workforce Development for the redevelopment of the College Corp program.

The College Corp program is a successful program that can help the Mohawk Valley tackle its top workforce issue – the retention of its young people -- needs the support of the Oneida County Board of Legislators to encourage Oneida County community-based employers to partner with County Government and offer more Oneida County-based college students meaningful, rewarding summer internships.

An allocation of \$32,000 will allow the Oneida County College Internship Program to provide 37 internship slots for Oneida County-based students, with the county's funding being matched by funding from employers.

Supplemental funding to address the high interest in internships from both students and local agencies would allow for the Internship Program, which began in 1998 with funding from the Board of Legislators, to meet the needs of local community agencies that want interns and can offer challenging, valuable experiences. This project would dovetail nicely with a state grant-funded internship project that is providing staff support for a regional internship effort focused on increasing the numbers of interns hired by the private sector.

Because of this grant, Supplemental Funding, once matched by employers, would be used solely to fund the salaries and related expenses (FICA, etc.) of summer interns. There would be no College Corps staff funded through this grant. The average cost of a student's salary and expenses (FICA, etc.) for the 200-hour internship over six to eight weeks is about \$1,700. The Supplemental Funding would fund half of 37 internship slots, with the employers' money funding the other half.

Our area is home to over 25,000 college students, many of which are from other areas of the country. In addition to these students are thousands of local high school graduates who attend college out of town. Our area has long struggled with retaining graduates in our area, and bringing back those who have left to seek other opportunities.

In 1998, you were a leader in creating a program aimed at offering internship programs for students returning home on summer break. Unfortunately, for a number of reasons this program did not reach its full potential in securing private sector participation, and funding for the College Corp Program was reduced in the 2008 budget.

Since taking office in January, I have been working closely with a number of agencies, including the Office of Workforce Development and David Mathis attempting to resurrect the program. We have developed a plan that uses existing staff at Workforce Development to run a program similar to the former College Corp. I believe that a reformed program will flourish, especially since the private sector has showed significant interest.

Therefore, I am requesting that the Board of Legislators appropriate \$32,000 to the College Corp Program to supplement costs for the summer, and look to transition the College Corp into a year round internship program. Thank you again for your consideration.

An Airport Improvement Program Grant description (AIP 3-3-0119-03-04) was recently amended by the Federal Aviation Administration to provide for an Airport Layout Plan (ALP) Update. This amendment allows the County to use remaining AIP funds that would otherwise have been lost. *However, we must act quickly as the FAA requires the Grant to be closed out by May 19th*. The Department of Aviation is therefore submitting the following Planning Services Agreement with C&S Engineers, Inc. in the amount of \$79,731.00 that provides for the planning services necessary to complete an FAA approved ALP update. The last Griffiss ALP was completed in 2003 and does not include the many improvements accomplished in the past five years. The FAA has already reviewed and approved the Consultant Agreement. Also, the County Board of Acquisition and Contract approval was received April 16, 2008.

Dear Mr. Picente:

As you may know, the County was recently named as a defendant in a lawsuit pertaining to a parcel of land on Oneida Street in New Hartford owned by Oneida County. The lawsuit was brought by Frank Ferraro, Harold Julian and Waddie Kalil, and seeks an Order from the Court directing the County of Oneida to convey its interest in said property to the plaintiffs. The plaintiffs' claim is based on the allegations briefly summarized below:

Mr. Kalil and his partners purchased a parcel of real property from George Rider (and others) back in 1983 (Parcel 1). The County also had an interest in that same parcel as a result of unpaid county taxes. Following their purchase of the Rider parcel, Mr. Kalil and his partners paid off the outstanding county taxes due on that parcel, in light of which the County transferred its interest to them.

For some reason which Mr. Kalil has not been able to satisfactorily explain to me or to the County Finance Office, he believes that when he paid the outstanding taxes due on the Rider parcel, that he was intending to and actually did purchase an adjoining parcel that was also, coincidentally, owned by the County of Oneida. This adjoining parcel (Parcel 2), is the subject of the lawsuit.

Absolutely no documentation has been presented by Mr. Kalil, nor does any documentation exist in the County Finance Office's records, that would support his contention. At no time did the County ever offer Parcel 2 for sale. In fact, it appears that Parcel 2 was acquired back in 1939 from one William Nelson for planning purposes and from that point forward, it was always carried on the roll as tax exempt property.

As far as I can gather, it appears that when both the Rider deed and the County deed relating to Parcel 1 were recorded in the registrar's office, the local Assessor erroneously concluded that these deeds related to two separate and distinct parcels. As a result, the Assessor placed **both** Parcel 1 and Parcel 2 in the plaintiff's names on the tax rolls, when, in fact, only Parcel 1 should have been put in their name. This problem was only recently discovered when a title examiner concluded that Mr. Kalil and his partners never obtained a deed to Parcel 2.

Mr. Kalil's primary contention is that the County must now do what it should have done then - <u>deed its interest in Parcel 2 over to him and his partners</u>. We previously went before the Supreme Court, and the Judge assigned to this case implied that the claim was without merit, but suggested that the matter could be resolved by allowing the plaintiffs to purchase Parcel 2 from the County for a fair price. That, now, seems to be the central issue – <u>what is a fair price</u>?

Both parties have obtained appraisals and there is a wide discrepancy between the two (they are about \$20,000 apart). Mr. Kalil believes that even if the higher appraiser were to prevail, he is of the opinion that the appraised value should be offset by all of the taxes paid by him and his partners over the past twenty five years. In all, he indicates that the amount paid **exceeds** the appraised value, and thus, he is proposing that the County sign over its interest for **no additional consideration**.

It is worth noting that both parcels have been listed for sale for the past twenty-five years and they have been unable to sell them before now. They recently received an offer to sell both parcels for a combined price of \$50,000 and, unless they are able to resolve this matter with the County, the deal will fall through.

I respectfully request that you refer this matter to the Board of Legislators for their review as any sale of Parcel 2 would have to be approved by them. Mr. Kalil and his partners are anxious for resolution, thus, your prompt attention is requested.
