Honorable Members:

In an effort to avoid duplication of services and increase the efficiencies of service, Oneida County is being asked to consolidate the day to day administration of our Empire Zone Services with the administrative services provided to the Rome Empire Zone.

Currently, the Mohawk Valley EDGE provides administrative staffing and expanded service resources to both Empire Zone programs. Because EDGE was handling zone coordination for both municipalities, the Empire State Development Corp. consolidated its administrative reimbursement under one funding contract. This consolidation of funding source is now driving the need to consolidate the administration of the programs so that EDGE may more efficiently provide program governance and realize a cost savings under the combined administrative budget.

Please be advised that this administrative consolidation will be implemented without, in any way, compromising the unique attributes and identities of the differing zones.

I support this consolidation of administrative services and ask the Board of Legislators to approve same at their earliest convenience. The consolidation was approved by the Rome Common Council on Wednesday, August 27, 2008.

RE: Oneida County and City of Rome Empire Zone administrative consolidation

Dear County Executive Picente and Mayor Brown,

Oneida County and the City of Rome have voiced an ongoing commitment to the consolidation of services and programs in order to reduce duplication as well as increase efficiencies of service. With that end in mind, Rome Industrial Development Corporation contracted with Mohawk Valley EDGE as of January 1, 2007 to provide staffing and expanded service resources.

One of the programs affected by this Services Agreement was the NYS Empire Zones program. The jobs of Zone Coordinator for the Rome as well as Oneida County Empire Zone were immediately consolidated into one position; consequently, Empire State Development consolidated its administrative reimbursement under one administrative funding contract. Consolidation progressed when the Rome Zone Administrative Board authorized Mohawk Valley EDGE to become its administrative entity [replacing Rome Industrial Development Corporation], effective July 1, 2007.

With financial consolidation complete, administrative consolidation in the area of program governance must now be made in order for Mohawk Valley EDGE to effectively administer this program and realize the cost savings assumed under a combined administrative budget. This final aspect of program consolidation will be made so as to

not compromise any of the unique attributes of either the Rome or Oneida County Empire Zones. As further protection for each municipality's interests, any program consolidation in this area must be approved by the Rome Common Council as well as the Oneida County Board of Legislators to become law.

Mohawk Valley EDGE is requesting your endorsement to the consolidation of the Rome and Oneida County Zone Administrative Boards into one entity, governed by a set of consolidated by-laws and one blended Zone Development Plan. Your action will pave the way for each current Zone Administrative Board to continue the consolidation process and further cement the strong working relationship for economic development between Oneida County and the City of Rome.

The total cost estimate is approximately \$2,340,000. In addition, via a separate contract the Town of Annsville has agreed to fund all costs not covered by Federal or State funding. Therefore, there will be no cost to Oneida County for this project.

In 2006 Oneida County contracted with Barton & Loguidice, to provide Preliminary Engineering and Design Services. Preparation of plans and specifications is complete and in order to advance this project it is now necessary to secure Construction Inspection and Construction Supervision services.

All design, construction and construction inspection services are eligible for 80% Federal and up to 15% State Aid. Therefore, Construction Inspection and Construction Supervision Services must be secured in accordance with Federal and State guidelines. As part of the Federal and State process, all Counties in NYSDOT Region 2 collectively established a pre-approved list of Consultants eligible to work on Locally Administered Federal Aid Projects. Federal guidelines were followed throughout the consultant selection process. Barton & Loguidice, P.C. was determined to be the most qualified consultant to provide Preliminary Engineering and Design Services. This selection was strictly based on qualifications, experience, past performance and familiarity with the Federal and State Aid process. Federal guidelines do not permit selection based on fee proposals.

Therefore, on August 27, 2008 the Oneida County Board of Acquisition & Contract accepted a proposal for \$191,000 (\$152,800 Federal, \$28,650 State, \$9,550 Town of Annsville) from Barton & Loguidice, P.C. to provide Construction Inspection and Construction Supervision services. If you concur, please forward the enclosed Supplemental Agreement to the Public Works Committee, Ways and Means Committee, and the Oneida County Board of Legislators for consideration.

Dear Mr. Picente,

We have been working with Chairman of the Internal Affairs Committee Pamela Mandryck to devise schedules and procedures with regard to HAVA implementation. Some of the main focuses include voter education and awareness, poll worker and voting machine custodian training and the consideration of potential polling site consolidations. Other points that we've concentrated on are the resolution of transportation issues for the voting machines as well as storage scenarios, budgetary concerns, legal requirements, office staffing and the day-to-day responsibilities. Many tasks need to be finalized in a short period of time and HAVA mandates will continue.

Counties across the state have had the responsibility of implementing statutory election reforms and have found it necessary to secure additional personnel to do so. To meet the demands of HAVA, it is imperative to not only ensure the continuity of existing staff, but to also request the inclusion of additional personnel.

At this time we are requesting the addition of four (4) permanent, part-time positions. We would ask that these positions be considered as Principal Clerks, Grade 19 Step 1 at \$22,371. While we cannot say for certain what other HAVA expenses may come our way, we believe this to be a cost effective measure at this time to adequately deal with the issues at hand. Once the remainder of the new voting machines is delivered to the recently acquired warehouse, we will also need to hire two (2) machine custodians as full time or part time employees to act as overseers of the facility, the machines and additional custodians. We believe a salary of \$20,000-\$30,000 would be fair depending on full time or part time status. A total of ten (10) custodians are presently anticipated to manage 130 machines. Eight of the ten would be paid by voucher as is the practice. Mileage fees must also be considered at this time.

Based on the above information and as time is always of the essence, we ask that you submit this request to the Board of Legislators.
