Dear Mr. Picente:

Plaintiff Chantal Bien-Aime, commenced action in the United State District Court, Northern District of New York against the County of Oneida, Oneida County Deputy Sheriff Mark Chrysler and the City of Rome Police Department for state and federal claims related to a false arrest charge and injuries suffered during an arrest that occurred on March 28, 2013.

I am in receipt of a letter, from David A. Bagley, attorney for the County and for Deputy Chrysler, recommending that the action against the County and Deputy Chrysler be settled in the amount of \$30,000. Mr. Bagley recommends the settlement on the basis of risk management.

This will be part of a global settlement of the litigation whereby the County will contribute \$30,000 and the City of Rome will contribute \$20,000 for an overall settlement amount of \$50,000 to be paid to plaintiff Chantal Bien-Aime. The payment will satisfy all claims from the plaintiff.

I agree with the recommendation of settlement from Mr. Bagley and I ask that this matter be referred to the Board of Legislators for their approval at their October 8, 2014 regular session.

The Sheriff's Office has been awarded funds from the Bureau of Justice Services for its participation in the State Criminal Alien Assistance Program (SCAAP) for FY 2014. The County has a contract with Justice Benefits, Inc. to prepare the application for inmates meeting certain criteria that must be retrieved from our inmate database and submitted to the Bureau of Justice Assistance. Use of these SCAAP funds is limited and must be earmarked for a specific purpose. The FY 2014 grant funds will be used to upgrade security equipment in the jail.

The FY 2014 grant award is \$16,841. Justice Services Inc. is entitled to a commission of the award. The remaining funds will be used to upgrade security equipment in the jail. I respectfully request that this matter be acted on at the Board of Legislators October board meeting.
