In accordance with the NYSDOT Procedures for Locally Administered Federal Aid Projects, Oneida County solicited an Expression of Interest (EOI) from each firm on the NYSDOT Region 2 LDSA County list. Each EOI was reviewed and scored on a qualifications basis. State and Federal procedures prohibit the use of consulting fees as a determining factor. It was decided that Delta Engineers, Architects, & Land Surveyors, D.P.C. (Delta) are the most qualified consultant for this project. On October 11, 2017 the Oneida County Board of Legislators approved a contract with Delta in the amount of \$78,957.00 for design services.

Design services have been completed and it is necessary to secure construction inspection and administration services. The Department of Public Works has negotiated a proposed contract amendment with Delta Engineers, Architects, & Land Surveyors, D.P.C. to provide construction inspection and administration services for \$87,533.00.

On May 9, 2018 the Oneida County Board of Acquisition and Contract accepted a proposal from Delta Engineers, Architects, & Land Surveyors, D.P.C. with a Lump Sum fee of \$87,533.00 to provide construction inspection and administration for reconstruction of the Woodhull Road Bridge over Woodhull Creek in the Town of Forestport.

Dear Chairman Fiorini:

In the 1940's Oneida County acquired property located at 3622 Skyline Drive in the Town of Kirkland. This property was originally acquired for the purpose of constructing and operating an emergency services radio transmission facilities site and other municipal radio transmission facilities. In the early 1960's all emergency services radio transmission facilities were relocated, and later all other municipal radio transmission facilities were relocated as well.

In the years following, numerous lease agreements were executed with private corporations and other organizations for the purpose of constructing transmission facilities (i.e. towers, equipment shelters, etc.), or installing transmission facilities on existing towers and in existing equipment shelters. At this time, the following organizations are operating and maintaining radio broadcast facilities or wireless communications facilities:

AT&T
Verizon Wireless
NexNav
Family Life Radio
Galaxy Communications
Roser Communications
National Grid

Annual lease revenues total approximately \$66,000.00 and annual operating and maintenance costs total approximately \$20,000.00. In 2019 it will be necessary to spend approximately \$250,000.00 on tower repairs, site security, communication equipment shelter repairs, vegetation removal, and access road repairs.

Therefore, I request the Board declare the parcel to be Surplus, and to authorize the disposition by auction of said property, including all physical assets and lease agreements. Please note that private ownership of said property will result in property tax revenues that may meet or exceed current net lease revenues.

Subj: IT Master Services Agreement Recommendation

Dear County Executive Picente:

Oneida County Central Services has utilized vendors to augment services, purchase equipment and support for all areas of County IT support. The services are critical to the function of the entire County's computer and network infrastructure. Often, the need for equipment or services can be planned and justified yet the execution of contract procurement is a timely process. More often, the contracts cover the same legalities and are duplicated repeatedly for the same vendors. A multivendor Master Service Agreement will assist Oneida County Central Services speed the process of planning, securing resources and executing projects into production. The enclosed agreement, with ComSource, Inc., is the first of the Master Service Agreements to be prepared, after the solicitation of vendors through a Request for Proposals.

A total of three vendors responded to RFP #2018-233. The plan for Central Services is to enter into agreements with all three vendors, and then assign projects to each of them, as-needed, based (in order of priority) upon the grade they received during the review of their proposals. The three approved companies are: Annese & Associates, Inc., ComSource, Inc. and Systems Management Planning, Inc. (SMP) respectively.

The attached Master Service Agreement will help Central Services procure and support Oneida County's infrastructure needs and to provide technical professional services as defined by Central Services management and project lists on an as-needed basis. The three vendors referenced above are currently familiar with the Oneida County infrastructure and Oneida County Central Services will continue to operate using Statements of Work that will ultimately be governed by the terms of this agreement. This agreement establishes all of the legal terms and conditions required by Oneida County, thereby providing assurance that Central Services will be safeguarded, and that contact details will be

consistent for the life of the three-year agreement. The contract will also have two one-year renewal options.

With this Master Services Agreement in place, Oneida County Central Services can better concentrate on the critical application of work that needs to be done to support Oneida County's technical infrastructure. The three vendors referenced above also are capable of supporting the proposed CISCO Voice Over IP (VOIP) telephone system that we are in the planning stages of. I respectfully request your approval of a three-year contract with two one- year options for an estimated cost of at least one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) per year with ComSource Inc. I am also requesting that this contract be approved as a template for agreements between the County and Annese & Associates, Inc. and SMP, respectively, with the same terms and conditions. If you approve, I would ask that you demonstrate your approval by endorsing this letter, and forwarding the same (with enclosures) to the Board of Legislators for approval at their next scheduled meeting.

As always, please feel free to contact me directly with any questions or concerns that you may have regarding this agreement.



In a continuing effort to assist Oneida County residents, we are proposing to apply for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding available through the New York State Office of Community Renewal (OCR) 2018 Competitive Round for Housing Activities.

Based on requirements from the OCR and The HomeOwnership Center's success with several existing programs in the County, we intend to apply for \$1,000,000 from the OCR to continue a Housing Rehabilitation Program. The proposed project for this year will provide housing rehabilitation services for 25-30 low income, frail elderly and/or disabled households of Oneida County.

Due to the OCR requirement that CDBG funding cannot be used in entitlement communities, the proposed funding for the Housing Rehabilitation/Manufactured Home Replacement Program will be for residents and communities outside of the Cities of Utica and Rome.
