Dear County Executive Picente:

The Climate Smart Communities Grant Program is a competitive 50/50 matching grant program for municipalities to implement projects focused on climate change adaptation and greenhouse gas (GHG) mitigation. Grants for up to \$2 million are available under this program. Grant program is offered through the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation's Office of Climate Change and funded by the Environmental Protection Fund. Oneida County received a one of these grants under the 2016 Consolidated Funding Application (CFA) program to cover a portion of the cost of constructing an Organics Processing Facility at the Oneida-Herkimer Solid Waste Authority Recycling Center/Transfer Station.

As you know, the Oneida County Water Pollution Control Plant is currently anaerobically digesting sludge and using the methane that is produced to generate electricity through micro turbines. The Organics Processing Facility referenced above is currently in startup mode and the facility has generated several loads of material that have been processed in the digesters.

The facility currently utilizes three (3) micro turbines that burn the methane and produce electricity. However, the facility has the space and was designed to have two (2) more micro turbines. Currently, anaerobic digesting just the sludge from the plant produces enough gas to keep all three turbines operational. It is anticipated that the addition of the organic material from the Organics Processing Facility will exceed the capacity of the existing micro turbines, thus not utilizing all the methane produced to generate electricity.

The Climate Smart Communities Grant program is again offering the opportunity through the Consolidated Funding Application program to construct or install equipment to facilitate acceptance of food waste at existing anaerobic digesters at wastewater treatment facilities. This offers the opportunity for Oneida County to apply for a grant to add the remaining two (2) micro turbines to insure that the facility can process all the methane gas generated by the anaerobic digesters.

I am requesting permission from you and the Board of Legislators to apply for this grant with the assistance of the Planning Department. It is anticipated that the matching funds for the grant would come from monies that have already spent making room to accommodate the additional turbines in the existing design.

I am respectfully requesting that the Board of Legislators pass a resolution authorizing the County to enter into a taxable equipment lease purchase agreement with ROC Leasing, LLC and First Security Finance, Inc. in the amount of \$15,512,000.00 in association with the energy performance contract at Griffiss International Airport. This lease will allow for one year of construction and thereafter will include annual payments for fifteen years. The interest rate on the lease is a fixed 4.14 percent. The remaining terms and conditions will be as approved by the County Attorney.

In addition, I am requesting a resolution authorizing the County to enter into an Escrow Agreement between ROC Leasing, LCC and City National Bank of Florida, to effectuate payment under the energy performance contract, upon terms and conditions as approved by the County Attorney.
