Over the past several years, we have taken significant strides in bringing our salaries in line with both public and private sector employers in our region. In your 2017 budget message, you laid out a 5 year plan to review salaries and make adjustments to bring salaries in line with other counties. Your 2020 Budget is year 4 of a 5 year plan.

In 2017 we reallocated the grades of more than 100 Department of Social Services positions in the UPSEU White Collar Unit, in 2018 we reallocated the grades of 30 positions in the UPSEU Blue Collar Unit and in 2019 we reallocated grades for 12 management positions and 5 positions in the UPSEU White Collar Unit. In keeping with your directive and in order to maintain that momentum, I am recommending the follow actions be taken in the Oneida County 2020 budget.

I am recommending the reallocation of Registered Professional Nurse and Public Health Nurse. Registered Professional Nurse should be reallocated from Grade 16N with a starting salary of \$37,502 to Grade 19N with a starting salary of \$41,132 and Public Health Nurse should be reallocated from Grade 19N with a starting salary of \$41,132 to Grade 22N with a starting salary of \$44,762. Also I ask that the board adopt the attached N Scale Salary Schedule to reflect the new grades. I am also recommending that the Supervising Public Health Nurse Grade 31M with a starting salary of \$46,847 be reallocated to Grade 33M with a starting salary of \$51,189.

The Oneida County Water Treatment Plant is undergoing extensive renovations and equipment upgrades.
