Dear County Executive Picente,

In May 2017, Oneida County executed a Bridge NY Local Project Agreement (LPA) with New York State that secured federal funds for the reconstruction of the Utica Street over Oriskany Creek Bridge in the Town of Whitestown. This bridge is owned, operated, and maintained by the Town of Whitestown. Therefore, Oneida County also executed an intermunicipal agreement with the Town of Whitestown that makes the Town responsible for any nonreimbursable expenditure.

On April 10, 2019, Oneida County approved Supplemental Agreement No. 1. Enclosed is Supplemental Agreement No. 2 to the LPA that will adjust funding to both the Detailed Design Phase and the Construction Phase. Once executed, the County will be eligible to receive reimbursement for up to \$1,330,000.00 in federal funds. Final total project expenditures are \$1,402,602.80, including a \$72,602.80 contribution from the Town of Whitestown. No County funds will be expended.

If acceptable, please forward the enclosed Supplemental Agreement No. 2 to the Oneida County Board of Legislators for consideration.

Dear County Executive Picente,

Oneida County currently contracts all janitorial cleaning services through New York State Industries for the Disabled, Inc. (NYSID), a NYS OGS approved preferred source vendor, and their sub-contractor Human Technologies Corporation (HTC). The previous contract officially ended December 31, 2018 but the County and NYSID agreed to extend it until NYS OGS approved the proposed scope and cost for the new contract. OGS has approved the scope and cost of the attached contract for janitorial cleaning services for 17 locations across Oneida County with a term of five (5) years; plus two (2) 36-month renewals, each subject to Board approval.

Oneida County is legally obligated to contract with qualified preferred source vendors and must do so without following requirements for open competitive bidding. The proposed contract may be terminated at any time with written notice.

Dear Chairman Fiorini:

As per the Commissioner of Public Works letter dated April 14, 2020, the Commissioner respectfully requests your Board of Legislators to approve a transfer, which will enable them to sign the Buildings and Grounds janitorial cleaning services contract. This has gone up substantially in price due to the prevailing wage schedule in New York State and also the extra cleaning being done to combat Covid 19.

Fortunately, there are still funds available in the Social Security Accounts due to relief from the Federal Government on delaying the employer share of Social Security for over two years. The employer share will have to be paid to the Federal Government in two payments, 50 percent will be due by December 31, 2021 and the other 50% payment will be due by December 31, 2022.

This will give the County time to replenish these funds at a later date.

I therefore request your Board's approval of the following 2020 transfer for the General Fund:

Dear County Executive Picente,

The Division of Buildings and Grounds is responsible for supplying janitorial cleaning services to all County facilities maintained by the Department of Public Works. The Division of Buildings and Grounds does not have the capabilities of supplying these services internally and as such contracts with New York State Industries for the Disabled (NYSID), per Section 162 of the New York State Finance Law, to provide these services. NYSID subcontracts with Human Technologies Corporation (HTC), a preferred source vendor, for all services.

Due to a significant increase in the prevailing wage schedule and other escalating factors, the cost of the new contract with NYSID exceeds available funding in the 2020 budget by approximately \$315,000.00. In addition, HTC has been directed to provide supplemental and/or enhanced services to minimize the spread of COVID-19. The additional cost for providing supplemental and/or enhanced services up to May 15, 2020 will be approximately \$100,000.00.

Therefore, I request a fund transfer to A1620.4951, Other Expenses, in the amount of \$415,000.00. If you concur, please forward this request to the Oneida County Board of Legislators for consideration.

Dear Chairman Fiorini:

As you and I have discussed, the COVID-19 pandemic has had a multitude of effects on the County and how we do business. A particular impact has been felt on our income sources. Certain revenues have diminished, some have been eliminated altogether and others, while they have not diminished, have been slower to come in to the County. In response to this, I have had my departments scour their budgets for reductions in expenditures and you and I have effected budgetary transfers within funds to enable the County to continue to meet its obligations on a timely basis.

Upon review of our current financial circumstances and in consultation with the Finance Commissioner, I anticipate that before the year is over it may be necessary to move money between funds. As the timing of such a transfer may not coincide with the Board schedule, I am requesting that the Commissioner of Finance be authorized to make those transfers between County funds that are necessary to meet our financial obligations. No expenditures would be made that have not already been approved by the Board. This would simply be a cash flow management device.

If you should have any questions, I am available, as are the Commissioner of Finance and the County Attorney. Thank you for your consideration.
