The Board of Elections Commissioners has requested to purchase computers and computer software which will enable each polling site to print out a current election ballot. This technology is currently being used in several other counties and has been deemed very cost effective. This technology will eliminate the printing of three ballots for each election for each registered voter. Printing this many ballots has resulted in wasting thousands of dollars each year. The Board of Elections has had destroy approximately \$50,000 in printed ballots in the last year alone.

Fortunately, the Board of Elections have several Grants available to help reduce this cost and the Oneida County Division of Information Technology has allocated \$65,000 in Capital Project H-433 Countywide Computerization Phase III.

I therefore, respectfully request your Board to act on this legislation and request your Board's approval of the following 2021 supplemental appropriation for the General Fund:

Reconstruction of the Marcy-SUNY IT Parkway will require a Revocable Permit from SUNY and ultimately permanent easements and limited property acquisitions. The enclosed Revocable Permit will allow construction activities to begin immediately on SUNY property without waiting for the lengthy process of acquiring permanent easements and securing property acquisitions.

If acceptable, please forward the enclosed Revocable Permit to the Oneida County Board of Legislators. Timing is critical and presentation to the Board of Legislators on October 13, 2021, would be extremely beneficial.
