

Dear Mr. Billard:

I am pleased to submit the attached proposed 2023 budget for the Oneida-Herkimer Solid Waste Authority, pursuant to Article IX, Section 9.2 of the Authority Bylaws and the Public Authorities Accountability Act of 2005. Highlights of the Authority's proposed budget and rates for 2023 include:

- The Authority will maintain tipping fees for municipal solid waste (MSW), sludge, and local solid waste (LSW). All other rates will also remain the same.
- The Authority will maintain rate for source separated organics (SSO) [food waste] of \$40 per ton. The Authority's SSO processing facility became operational in second quarter 2019 and will process SSO to be diverted from the landfill and converted to electricity.
- In 2023, the Authority will continue to offer two reduced tip fee programs to assist Oneida-Herkimer Counties and its municipalities. The first program provides for reduced tip fees for disposal of debris following a disaster, such as a flood (\$42.00 per ton). The second program provides for reduced tipping fees to assist Industrial Development Agencies and Developers related to Brownfield clean-up and Industrial Development Projects (\$42.00 per ton). Both programs require an application and Board approval.



#### **REVENUE HIGHLIGHTS**

- 2023 projected tonnage estimates based upon 8-month actual tonnage in 2022 and a review of historical data.
- Sale of recyclables revenues forecasted with 8-month data from 2022, historical review and market projections for 2023.
- The out of county recyclables processing revenue has slightly increased with the projected annual tonnage from Oswego, Lewis and Fulton Counties. Projected revenue is \$875,700.
- The Authority will continue to operate two engines at its power facility as per its agreement with WM Renewable Energy.
- Carbon credit revenue is budgeted through December 2023. Projected revenue is \$595,000.
- The Authority will continue to waive the permit fee for the haulers/businesses and municipalities for 2023.

#### **EXPENSE HIGHLIGHTS**

- Health insurance expense budgeted at 10% increase over 2022 premiums.
- Budget reflects \$460,000 of contracted direct payments made to the Town of Ava and the Town and Villages of Boonville, consistent with our Host Community Agreements.
- Fuel expense was budgeted at \$5.00 per gallon as the result of industry forecasts.
- Capital projects funded through tipping fees will be \$456,000 for 2023.
- Public education expenses are projected to be \$75,000.
- Workers' compensation budget is based upon 5-year average of the Authority's actual claims.
- The annual contributions to the NYS Retirement System will stay consistent with 2022 costs as rates have remained relatively the same.

#### **MUNICIPAL BUDGETS**

• The Authority manages the waste and recyclables collection systems for the City of Utica and the Village of Ilion, Frankfort, Mohawk, Herkimer and Dolgeville. The Authority currently maintains a separate accounting system for each municipality.

A public hearing and an overview of the proposed 2023 budget will be held preceding the November 21, 2022 Board meeting at 4:30 PM. A vote on the proposed 2023 budget is anticipated at the December 19, 2022 meeting.

As you are aware, the heads of various legal departments in County Government have been speaking with you regarding the need to have attorneys on-call in the evenings, on weekends and on holidays, to address matters that often arise outside of regular business hours. department has experienced difficulty in securing volunteers to cover these assignments. In an effort to ensure adequate volunteer coverage, and to compensate attorneys who take these on-call assignments, your 2023 operating budget included funding to pay a stipend to attorneys who are designated on-call.

To that end, enclosed is the proposed Oneida County Attorney On-Call Policy that details the obligations and expectations of those attorneys who are designated to be on-call. The policy also details the compensation that will be paid to each attorney who is designated to be on-call.

If you concur, I respectfully requested that you forward this request to the Board of Legislators for consideration at their December meeting. As always, I am available to answer any questions either you or the Board have regarding this matter.

#### ONEIDA COUNTY ATTORNEY ON-CALL POLICY

#### I. Scope

This policy applies to all individuals holding an attorney title for Oneida County, except for the elected District Attorney.

#### II. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to provide guidelines for attorneys who are required to maintain their availability after hours and be on-call to come back to work or to otherwise be available to respond to situations requiring an attorney after hours and on weekends and holidays. This policy is not applicable to regular work performed by an attorney that may occur after hours. Further, this policy is not applicable to appearance at Oneida County's Centralized Arraignment Part ("CAP") courts.

#### III. Policy and Procedures

#### A. Identification and Notification.

- 1. The Department Head or his/her designee shall identify each attorney who is required, as a condition of employment, to be on-call to come back to work outside of the attorney's regular shift.
- 2. Assignment of on-call shifts may be made on a volunteer basis, or on an involuntary basis at the discretion of the Department Head or his/her designee.
- 3. The Department Head or his/her designee shall notify the on-call attorney in writing of the days and times the attorney is on-call.
- 3. No more than two (2) attorneys shall be designated as on-call at the same time in any legal department.

#### B. On-Call Requirements

- 1. Unless otherwise advised by the Department Head or his/her designee, in his or her sole discretion, the attorney is not required while on-call to remain in Oneida County. However, the attorney must (i) remain available by telephone, text and email; (ii) remain in an area of mobile phone and internet connectivity at all times while on-call; and (iii) respond to any contact within fifteen (15) minutes.
- 2. The on-call attorney must remain free of the influence of alcohol or other substances. In addition, the on-call attorney should not take any prescription drug that adversely affects his or her ability to safely and effectively perform his or her job duties. If an attorney has a medical condition and has concerns about complying with this requirement, the attorney should consult with the Personnel Department.

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- 3. If the attorney has a conflict and is unable to be on-call during his or her assigned time, it is the attorney's obligation to pre-arrange with his or her Department Head or his/her designee for a replacement to cover the attorney's on-call shift.
- 4. If an attorney has an unplanned absence during his or her shift immediately prior to the on-call duty, the Department Head or his/her designee may, in his or her sole discretion, designated an alternate attorney to cover the on-call shift.
- 4. Attorneys who fail to respond when called and/or who fail to find a replacement in consultation with the Department Head or his/her designee are subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination.

#### C. On-Call Pay

1. Attorneys will receive the lump sum payment of \$150.00 per each shift of on-call status that occurs on a weekday that is not a "holiday" designated as a paid holiday for attorneys. Weekday shifts are as follows:

4:30 p.m. Friday – 8:30 a.m. Saturday
```

2. Attorneys will receive the lump sum payment of \$250.00 per each shift of on-call status that occurs on a weekend and/or a "holiday" designated as a paid holiday for attorneys. Weekend shifts are as follows:

8:30 a.m. Saturday – 8:30 a.m. Sunday 8:30 a.m. Sunday – 8:30 a.m. Monday
```

Holiday shifts are as follows:

8:30 a.m. on the day designated as a paid holiday for attorneys  $-\,8:30$  a.m. the following day

The holiday on-call payment shall be made to the attorney who is designated to be on-call on the actual paid holiday, not on the observed day where the holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday. Attorneys designated to be on-call on an "observed" holiday day shall be compensated at the regular weekday rate.

3. Attorneys who are called to work while on-call will receive no additional compensation for hours actually worked.

Dear County Executive Picente:

I am enclosing correspondence from Claims Administrator, Gus Boucher, recommending payment of \$5,470.68 to State Farm for reimbursement of loss of income and medical expenses paid on behalf of Kira VanHoeven.

Ms. VanHoeven was operating a vehicle belonging to her father, Scott VanHoeven, on October 29, 2021 when she was involved in an accident with a Department of Public Works vehicle at the intersection of Thomas Road and Marsh Road in the Town of Lee.

The Board of Acquisition and Contract previously approved a property damage settlement with Scott VanHoeven in the sum of \$7,100.00 for the vehicle damage and \$1,400.00 with Kirk's Auto Repair for towing and storage fees.

Ms. VanHoeven has been treating with a medical provider relative to injuries sustained in the accident. To date, her automobile insurance company, State Farm, has paid \$120.00 in lost wages and \$5,350.68 in medical expenses. The payment of these funds when added to the amounts previously paid for the property damage exceeds the settlement limit for the Board of Acquisition and Contract and necessitates that payment for these expenses be approved by the Board of Legislators.

State Farm has submitted a Personal Injury Loss Transfer Claim seeking reimbursement of the expenses paid through September 14, 2022 pursuant to Section 5105(a) of the Insurance Law. An Arbitration has been scheduled for December 15, 2022. Payment needs to be made prior to that date in order to avoid the cost of retaining outside counsel to represent Oneida County in the Arbitration. Therefore, I have obtained consent from the Ways and Means Committee of the Board of Legislators to remit payment to State Farm, with the understanding that the Board of Legislators will retroactively approve the payment at the December 21, 2022 meeting.

Accordingly, I recommend and request that the Board of Legislators authorize the retroactive payment as outlined herein.

I have attached the job specification for the title Traffic Safety Instructor. I have added the title to the Oneida County Classification Plan.

Historically, the County has contracted with instructors to teach various traffic safety courses. Over time, this has become challenging, as the cost to obtain certification to teach these courses has risen. In addition, the need for delivery of these courses continues to grow. In discussions with Emergency Services Director, Edward Stevens, and Stop-DWI Coordinator, Eric Townsend, we have determined that the best way to ensure that the County has available instructors to meet these needs is to create the position as a County title. This will allow for paid training and certification for those individuals who are willing to deliver this instruction.

I am recommending that the salary for this title be set at \$50.00 per hour. This hourly rate is comparable to the hourly rate we currently pay to independent contractors for this service.
