LOCAL LAW INTRO. D OF 2019 LOCAL LAW NO. ____ OF 2019

A LOCAL LAW ESTABLISHING A SNOWMOBILE SEASON IN ONEIDA COUNTY

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY LEGISLATORS OF THE COUNTY OF ONEIDA AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE AND INTENT.

The County of Oneida has hundreds of miles of groomed snowmobile trails, crossing both public and private property. Trail Maintenance Entities maintain these trails, and determine when trails are appropriate for use. To ensure there is adequate snow cover on these trails for snowmobiles, a Snowmobile Season shall be established.

The Oneida County Legislature hereby finds that it is in the best interest of the residents and visitors to Oneida County to enact this Local Law to preserve the snowmobiling trails in Oneida County, to ensure the safety of snowmobilers on those trails, and to protect the property of Oneida County landowners who own land adjacent to snowmobile trails, and who provide access to the snowmobile trails through their property.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS.

"Big Game Gun Season" - Late Bow and Muzzleloading hunting season, as defined by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.

"Northern-Southern Zone Line" – A line defined by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, commencing at a point at the north shore of the Salmon river and its junction with Lake Ontario and extending easterly along the north shore of that river to the village of Pulaski, thence southerly along Route 11 to its intersection with Route 49 in the village of Central Square, thence easterly along Route 49 to its junction with Route 365 in the city of Rome, thence easterly along Route 365 to its junction with Route 28 in the village of Trenton, thence easterly along Route 28 to its junction with Route 29 in the village of Middleville, thence easterly along Route 29 to its junction with Route 4, thence northerly along Route 4 to its junction with Route 22, thence northerly and westerly along Route 22 to the eastern shore of South Bay on Lake Champlain in the village of Whitehall, thence northerly along the eastern shore of South Bay to the New York-Vermont boundary.

"Northern Tier" - The section of land located to the North of the Northern-Southern Zone Line.

"Snowmobile" - A self-propelled vehicle equipped with a motor, originally manufactured and designed for travel on snow or ice,

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steered by skis or runners and supported in whole or in part by one or more skis, belts or tracked cleats.

"Snowmobile Operator" - Any person who operates or is in actual physical control of a Snowmobile.

"Snowmobile Season" - The timeframe during which Snowmobile Operators may utilize the Trail System, as further defined in Section 3 below.

"Southern Tier" - The section of land located to the South of the Northern-Southern Zone Line.

"TME" or "Trail Maintenance Entities" or "TMEs" – The New York State Snowmobile Association clubs located in Oneida County that are responsible for maintaining the Trail System.

"Trail System" - A system of Snowmobile trails marked and maintained throughout Oneida County by the Trail Maintenance Entities.

SECTION 3. SNOWMOBILE SEASON.

Snowmobiles may enter upon and use the Trail System only during Snowmobile Season. Snowmobile Season shall be defined as follows:

- a. Snowmobile Season Northern Tier- Snowmobile Season in the Northern Tier of Oneida County shall commence the first day after the last day of Big Game Gun Season, so long as there is also a sufficient amount of packed base snow on the trail, as determined and announced by the TME responsible for that portion of the Trail System, and in consultation with the private landowners adjacent to that Trail System.
- b. Snowmobile Season Southern Tier- Snowmobile Season in the Southern Tier of Oneida County shall commence the first day after the last day of Big Game Gun Season, so long as there is also a sufficient amount of packed base snow on the trail, as determined and announced by the TME responsible for the Trail System, and in consultation with the private landowners adjacent to that Trail System.
- c. Throughout the Snowmobile Season, it shall be the responsibility of the TMEs to determine if there is sufficient base snow cover for Snowmobiles to operate, and to consult with the private landowners over which those trails run, and announce whether their respective portions of the Trail System are open for Snowmobile use.
- d. Throughout Snowmobile Season, it shall be the responsibility of the Snowmobile Operator to consult their local TME to see if the portion of the Trail System they wish to ride on is open for Snowmobile use. Snowmobile Operators shall comply with any guidance issued by the TMEs and shall refrain from entering on or using the Trail System in the event portions of, or all of, the Trail System is closed by the TMEs.

SECTION 4. END OF SNOWMOBILE SEASON.

Snowmobile Season shall end on April 15th of each year. After April 15th, Snowmobiles shall not be permitted on any part of the Trail System.

SECTION 5. PROHIBITION AGAINST RIDING ON CLOSED TRAILS.

In the event trail conditions are unsuitable to Snowmobile use, and the TMEs close a portion or all of the Trail System they maintain, by either closing gates, placing barriers, posting signs, or by otherwise notifying the public that a trail is closed, Snowmobile Operators are prohibited from riding on those closed trails.

SECTION 6. PROHIBITION AGAINST LEAVING MARKED TRAILS.

Snowmobile Operators must ride on the Trail System, and are prohibited from straying from and entering upon private property adjacent to the Trail System. All Snowmobile Operators must stay between the trail markers, stakes, poles, and any notifying devices used by the TMEs to mark the Trail System.

SECTION 7. VIOLATIONS OF LAW.

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- a. All provisions of the New York State Penal Law, including Criminal Mischief in the Fourth Degree, as defined by New York State Penal Law § 145.00, Trespass, as defined by New York State Penal Law § 140.05, and Criminal Trespass in the Third Degree, as defined by New York State Penal Law § 140.10, shall remain in full force and effect, and the Snowmobile Operator will be subject to those criminal penalties as prescribed within the Penal Law.
- b. All provisions of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation Law § 25.23 shall apply regarding the negligent operation of a Snowmobile.
 - c. All other existing Federal, State, and Local laws and regulations must be followed by all Snowmobile Operators.

SECTION 8. ENFORCEMENT.

The provisions of this Local Law shall be enforced by all law enforcement entities operating throughout Oneida County, including the Oneida County Sheriff's Department.

SECTION 9. SEVERABILITY.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, subdivision or other part of this Local Law or its applications shall be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalidated or unconstitutional, such order or judgement shall not affect, impair, or otherwise invalidate the remainder of this Local Law which shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 10. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Local Law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State in accordance with Sections 20, 21, and 27 of New York State Municipal Home Rule Law.

- (a) Such Commissioner shall make such written reports and furnish such information to the New York State Department of Social Services with respect to the work of the (e)County social services district as are required by the Social Services Law and by the State Department of Social Services. Copies thereof shall be filed with the Board of County Legislators and the County Executive.
- (b) Such Commissioner shall make and file on or before the 1st day of March of each year an annual written report to the Board of County Legislators and the County Executive concerning the work of the County social services district and additional reports at such time and covering such matters as the County Executive or Board of County Legislators by resolution may require.

Section 100(5)4. <u>Deputy Commissioners</u>. The Commissioner shall, when such positions are authorized by the Board of County Legislators and within the limits of the appropriations provided therefor, have the power to appoint such deputies, officers, assistants, and employees as he may deem necessary for the performance of his duties. The $(\textcircled{+})\underline{D}$ eputy $(\textcircled{+})\underline{C}$ ommissioners shall act for and on behalf of the Commissioner and shall perform such duties as he may prescribe.

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Section 100(6)5. Welfare Rates and Charges. The Commissioner shall, when submitting the estimate of revenues and expenditures for the (a)Department of (social services) to the Budget Director, include therein recommendations for rates to be paid by the (e)County to foster homes and such other rates as may be necessary or required to be paid by the (e)County for services rendered for the care and maintenance of persons for whom the (d)Department (of social services) is responsible under the requirements of the Social Services Law or any other applicable law. Such rates, if and as approved by the County Executive, shall be included in the tentative budget. The Board of County Legislators shall, by resolution and part of the budget procedure, determine, fix and establish the rates to be paid by the (e)County for such services.

Section 100(7)6. Accounting for Fees and Funds.

- (a) All monies to which the (e)County may be entitled under and by virtue of the laws of the State of New York, or which the (e)Commissioner may receive for official services by him, or by any of his deputies, assistants, clerks, employees or subordinates, shall apply to and be for the benefit of the (e)County and shall be collected by such Commissioner of Social Services, accounted for and paid over to the Commissioner of Finance within five (5) days after the expiration of each month. Each such statement shall have attached thereto a certification by said the Commissioner of Social Services to the effect that the same is in all respects a full and true statement of all such monies received by him for the preceding month.
- (1) At the time of rendering any such statement, (such)the Commissioner of Social Services shall pay to the Commissioner of Finance, for the benefit of (said)the (e)County, all monies received by him since the last preceding monthly report. Other funds or fees collected by the Commissioner of Social Services shall be collected, paid over, deposited and reported as above provided, except where otherwise specifically provided by statute.
- ((b) The commissioner shall deposit with the Commissioner of Finance within five (5) days after he has received same, any and all monies received by him for the use of a particular inmate or inmates of the county home.)

Section 100(8)7. Other Duties. The Commissioner shall perform such other duties as may be directed by the Board of County Legislators, the County Executive or by any law or by any officer of the ($\underline{\bullet}$)State not inconsistent with the ($\underline{\bullet}$)Charter or this ($\underline{\bullet}$)Code.

Section 2003. Additional Appointments by County Executive.

- (a) ___Subject to confirmation by the Board of County Legislators and except as otherwise provided in the (e) Charter or this (e) Code, the County Executive shall appoint the head of any other or additional administrative unit of the (e) County, including among others but not limited to, the (d) Director of Emergency (management) Services, the (d) Director of the (v) Veterans' (s) Service Agency, the Youth Bureau Director, (f) Fire (e) Coordinators, and the (e) County (h) Historian, all of whom shall be residents of the County of Oneida and serve at the pleasure of the County Executive subject to (confirmation by the Board of Legislators.)
- (b) The Board of County Legislators, as provided in the (e)Charter or this (e)Code, may continue, consolidate or abolish any of the above units and upon written recommendation of the County Executive grant them departmental status by resolution by the Board of County Legislators.
- (c) ((a))The (emergency management e)Office of Emergency Services shall be headed by a (d)Director who shall be appointed by the County Executive, subject to confirmation by the Board of County Legislators on the basis of his administrative experience and (his)qualifications for the duties of (his) such office. He shall have and exercise all the powers and duties heretofore and hereafter lawfully conferred or imposed upon him by the (e)Charter, this (e)Code, ordinance and resolutions of the Board of County Legislators, order or direction of the County Executive, by local law, by the New York State Defense Emergency act being chapter 784 of the laws of 1951, as amended, and by any other applicable law not inconsistent with the (e)Charter or this (e)Code.

All positions in all departments, offices, institutions, and agencies of the (e)County, shall be in the classified service, except those held by the following: (1) elective officers; (2) heads of departments; (3) the (m)Medical €Examiner; (4) the (e)Commissioner of (i)Jurors; (5) all officers and employees of the Board of County Legislators; (6) all members, officers and employees of the Board of Elections; and (7) all other persons as specifically prescribed by statute. For the purpose of this section, the heads of the divisions within the €Executive (→Branch, including but not limited to (b)Budget, (p)Purchase, (Central Services)Information Technology, and (t)Traffic (s)Safety (and the Youth and related programs), shall be deemed to be the heads of departments. The following positions in the classified service shall be included in the exempt class: (1) deputies who are authorized to act generally for and on behalf of their principals; (2) the (e)Confidential (s)Secretary to any officer or department head; (3) (personnel officer) Commissioner of Personnel; (4) (a)Assistant (d)District (a)Attorneys (and); (5) Confidential Criminal Investigators; $(\underline{6}(\underline{5}))$ (a) Assistant (e) County (a) Attorneys; $(\underline{7}(\underline{6}))$ Deputy and Assistant Public Defenders; and (8) all other persons as specifically provided by statute. For purposes of this section, the heads of the Youth Bureau and related programs, and Veterans' Service Agency within the Department of Family and Community Services shall be deemed to be heads of departments. (Not withstanding) Notwithstanding any other provision of the Charter or this ©Code or charter, wherever the appointment of a deputy is authorized, such deputy is hereby authorized to act generally for and in place of his principal and the same shall be deemed to be in the exempt class of the classified service of civil service. 11. That Article XXV of the Oneida County Administrative Code shall be amended by the deletion of all matters that are in parenthesis and (stricken) and the addition of all matters in bold and underlined as set forth below: ARTICLE XXV OFFICE FOR THE AGING AND CONTINUING CARE (Section 2501. Office for the Aging and Continuing Care; Director Section 2502. Powers and Duties Section 2501. Office for the Aging and Continuing Care; Director. There shall be an office for the aging and continuing care, the head of which shall be the director of the office for the aging and continuing care who shall be appointed by the County Executive, subject to the confirmation of the Board of County Legislators.
