# RE: LOCAL LAW INTRODUCTORY "I" PROHIBITING CYBER-BULLYING WITHIN ONEIDA COUNTY

Section 1. Legislative Intent.

Bullying is a long-standing problem in Oneida County and throughout the country. With the proliferation of the use of electronic means of communication, bullying has transformed from a predominately school-based issue among youth to a broader societal problem affecting both youth and adults.

Researchers have demonstrated that bullying has long-term consequences. Furthermore, bullying now goes beyond the classroom to the internet, athletic teams, college campuses, work places, and amongst the general public.

Victims of cyber-bullying suffer very real and serious harm as a result of these incidents, often showing signs of depression, anxiety, social isolation, nervousness when interacting with technology, low self-esteem, declining school and work performance, hyper-vigilance, nightmares, changed eating and sleeping habits, and fear for their safety.

Cyber-bullying has been shown to cause significant psychological trauma to the victims. In some cases, victims attempt or commit suicide due to, in part, the cyber-bullying they have endured.

Perpetrators of cyber-bullying are often more extreme in the threats and taunts they inflict on their victims, as they do not actually see their victim's emotional reaction to the abuse and may believe that they are anonymous.

Researchers have identified *negative impacts to all* who are involved in cyber-bullying, including the victims, perpetrators, and bystanders, as well as their families. "Bullying is associated with other forms of antisocial behavior such as vandalism, shoplifting, and truancy (workplace absences), dropping out of school (high workplace turnover), fighting (hostile work environment), and drug use, as well as negative emotions which are sometimes resolved in deviant ways."

Cyber-bullying frequently escalates into off-line stalking and harassment, including harassing and repeated phone calls, threats, obscene mail, vandalism, trespassing and physical assault.

Cyber-bullying is far more than a social issue and has short-term and long-term negative impacts on health, schools, workplaces and society. There are increased costs to the health care system for treating

bullying-related health conditions; "Bullying behavior affects a target's ability to perform their jobs, which can impact the morale of employees and the financial performance of an organization." cschools experience an adverse effect on their environments and a loss of revenue due to drop out rates; Society suffers from a drain on resources within the justice and social service systems.

Experts have suggested that one tool for schools and for workplaces to use in combating bullying is to maintain and enforce consistent policies against bullying and harassment, including cyber-bullying. Such enforcement is not always possible when bullying occurs away from school or away from the workplace. A bullied victim can no longer count on respite from attacks upon returning home from school or work. Cyber-bullying can be an inescapable 24-hour, 7-day a week problem.

Several states have enacted laws criminalizing cyber-bullying. To date, the New York State Legislature has failed to fully take action on this problem. Oneida County should not wait for New York State to take action, and should implement legislation to discourage and prevent cyber-bullying from occurring.

Therefore, the purpose of this Local Law is to prohibit cyber-bullying in Oneida County.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the Board of County Legislators of the County of Oneida, State of New York, as follows:

Section 1. Definitions.

As used in this Local Law, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

- A. County -shall mean the County of Oneida, New York.
- B. Cyber-bullying shall mean harassment or bullying accomplished by publishing, communicating or causing a communication to be initiated or displayed, through mechanical or electronic means, including, but not limited to, internet-based communication, electronic mail, social networking sites, web sites, and cellular telephones.
- C. Harassment or bullying shall mean:
  - 1. The creation and/or publishing of any form of verbal or written communication, or visual material, with the malicious and willful intent to coerce, extort, abuse, torment, threaten, terrify or intimidate a specific other person, that serves no legitimate purpose, and causes such other person to suffer:
    - a. Actual and reasonable fear of physical harm to himself or herself, a member of such person's immediate family or a third party with whom such person is acquainted; or

- b Actual and reasonable fear of damage to the property of such person or member of such person's immediate family or a third party with whom such person is acquainted; or
- c. A substantially detrimental effect on his or her physical, mental or emotional health.
- 2. For the purposes of subdivision one of this section, "form of verbal or written communication, or visual material" shall include, but not be limited to, a 'recording' as defined in Penal Law § 275.00(6), but shall not include constitutionally protected speech.
- 3. Harassment or bullying includes, but is not limited to:
  - a. Constructing a fake profile or website; or
  - b. Posting a real or doctored image on the Internet of such other person; or
  - c. Using a computer system for repeated, continuing or sustained electronic communications to such other person, including, but not limited to electronic mail or other transmissions; or
  - d. Making any statement, whether true or false intended to immediately provoke, and that is likely to provoke, any third party to harass or bully, as defined in subdivision one of this section, another person.
- D. Person shall mean any natural person or individual, corporation, unincorporated association, proprietorship, firm, partnership, joint venture, joint-stock association, or other entity or business organization of any kind.
- E. Publishing shall mean the issuing, printing, reproducing, distributing, circulating or any other means of communicating to other individuals, including through mechanical or electronic means.

#### Section 2. Prohibitions.

No person shall engage in cyber-bullying against any other person when such other person is located in the County of Oneida.

#### Section 3. Enforcement

This Local Law shall be enforced by any certified law enforcement officer within his or her respective jurisdiction within the geographical boundaries of Oneida County, by either arrest of, or the issuance of a summons to, a person violating the provisions of this law and requiring his or her appearance before a court of competent jurisdiction.

#### Section 4. Prosecution.

Pursuant to Section 1702 of the Oneida County Charter, the District Attorney is required and delegated the duty to prosecute any and all violations of this Local Law, provided the alleged perpetrator is over sixteen years of age. If the alleged perpetrator is over seven and less than sixteen years of age, then the County Attorney shall present any and all violations of this Local Law by way of a juvenile delinquency petition in Family Court.

#### Section 5. Penalties.

Any person found to be in violation of this Local Law shall be guilty of an unclassified misdemeanor, and shall be subject to a fine of no less than \$500, but not to exceed \$1,000, and/or a term of imprisonment not to exceed one year.

Section 6. Applicability.

This Local Law shall apply to all actions occurring on or after the effective date of this Local Law.

Section 7. Reverse Preemption.

This added Local Law shall be null and void on the day that statewide or federal legislation goes into effect, incorporating either the same or substantially similar provisions as are contained in this Local Law, or in the event that a pertinent state or federal administrative agency issues and promulgates regulations preempting such action by the County of Oneida. The County Legislature may determine by resolution whether or not identical or substantially similar statewide or federal legislation has been enacted for the purposes of triggering the provisions of this section.

Section 8. Effective Date.

This Local Law shall become effective immediately upon the filing with the New York Secretary of State pursuant to Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

Section 9. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this Local Law or the application thereof, to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity or circumstance, shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order of judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.
