A LOCAL LAW AMENDING THE ONEIDA COUNTY CHARTER

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY LEGISLATORS OF THE COUNTY OF ONEIDA, STATE OF NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

1. That Article III, Section 306 of the Oneida County Charter shall be amended by the deletion of all matters that are stricken and the addition of all matters in **bold and underlined** as set forth below:

Section 306. Division of Purchase. There shall be in the office of the County Executive, a dDivision of pPurchase, the head of which shall be a Purchasing Director who shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the County Executive, subject to confirmation by the Board of County Legislators. The Purchasing Director shall, in accordance with the requirements as to advertising and competitive bidding, make purchases and sales of all materials, supplies and equipment and contract for the rental or servicing of equipment for the eCounty, except as otherwise provided in this eCharter or the eCode. He shall not contract for or furnish any services, equipment or other articles except upon the receipt of authorized requisitions and the certification(s) as to availability of funds. He shall also have the powers and perform such duties in relation to printing and mail delivery services as defined in the Code.

2. That Article III, Section 306.1 of the Oneida County Charter shall be amended by the deletion of all matters that are stricken and the addition of all matters in **bold and underlined** as set forth below:

Section 306.1. Bureau of Weights and Measures. The Bureau of Weights and Measures shall be headed by the County Director of Weights and Measures. He shall possess all of the qualifications required for, and shall have all the powers and duties of, a county director of weights and measures now or hereafter granted or imposed by Article 16 of the Agriculture and Markets Law of the State of New York, local law, ordinance or resolution of the Board of County Legislators, order or direction of the County Executive, or pPurchasing dDirector, and

any applicable provision of any act of the legislature not inconsistent with thise e $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$ harter or $\underline{\mathbf{the}}$ e $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$ ode.

- <u>(a)</u> Whenever the e<u>C</u>ounty d<u>D</u>irector of w<u>W</u>eights and m<u>M</u>easures is required by any s<u>S</u>tate law to make a report, he shall, at the same time, file a written copy thereof with the <u>purchasing</u> director <u>County Executive</u> and the Board of <u>County</u> Legislators.
- <u>(b)</u> The e<u>C</u>ounty d<u>D</u>irector of <u>w</u>Weights and <u>m</u>Measures shall be appointed by the County Executive, subject to confirmation by the Board of <u>County</u> Legislators.
- 3. That Article III, Section 307 of the Oneida County Charter shall be amended by the deletion of all matters that are stricken and the addition of all matters in **bold and underlined** as set forth below:

Section 307. Division of Central Services Information Technology. There shall be in the office of the County Executive a dDivision of Central Services Information Technology headed by an Information Technology Central Services Director who shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the County Executive, subject to confirmation by the Board of County Legislators. Such dDirector shall have the powers and perform such duties in relation to, and including but not limited to establishing and implementing an information technology infrastructure comprised of an integrated, secure, scalable and modernized system which serves to promote the efficient and cost effective delivery of services, to, from, and between the citizens of the County, our departments and allied agencies, both public and private; maintaining a central repository of commonly used goods and materials for departmental use; and printing and mail delivery services as shall be prescribed in the administrative code.

4. This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State in accordance with Sections 20, 21 and 27 of the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law.

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING THE ONEIDA COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE CODE

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY LEGISLATORS OF THE COUNTY OF ONEIDA, STATE OF NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

1. That Article III, Section 306 of the Oneida County Administrative Code shall be amended by the deletion of all matters that are stricken and the addition of all matters in **bold and underlined** as set forth below:

Section 306. Division of Purchase.

- (a) The $p\underline{P}$ urchasing $d\underline{D}$ irector shall be the head of the $d\underline{D}$ ivision of $p\underline{P}$ urchase and shall have the powers and duties set forth in Section 306 of Article 3 of the charter. He shall, in addition to his powers and duties, set forth in the $e\underline{C}$ harter or \underline{this} $e\underline{C}$ ode, perform such other and related duties as the County Executive may require.
- (b) The $p\underline{P}$ urchasing $d\underline{D}$ irector shall:
 - (1) eEstablish and maintain a central purchasing system;
- (2) eEstablish and enforce standard specifications with respect to supplies, materials, equipment, and services;
- (3) <u>iInspect</u> or supervise, or otherwise provide for the inspection of all deliveries of supplies, materials and equipment and determine their quality, quantity and conformance to contract;
- (4) e $\underline{\mathbf{E}}$ stablish and maintain necessary contact and liaison with the d $\underline{\mathbf{D}}$ ivision of Central Services Information Technology, including but not limited to procedure for coordinating the controls as set forth relating to the disbursement and transfer of supplies, materials and equipment under the custody of the d $\underline{\mathbf{D}}$ ivision of Central Services Information Technology to any e $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$ ounty administrative unit;
- (5) \underline{s} Eell or lease any surplus, obsolete or unused supplies, materials and equipment under such rules and regulations as may be established by resolution of the Board of County Legislators;

- (6) <u>u</u>Upon the request of any city, town, village, school district or other unit of local government, act as purchasing agent for the same, either for all or for any part of its purchases, upon such conditions as may be prescribed by the Board of County Legislators;
- (7) Except as otherwise provided in the e<u>C</u>harter or <u>this</u> e<u>C</u>ode, and subject to the approval of the County Executive, approve and execute all contracts on behalf of the e<u>C</u>ounty with respect to the buying, selling or leasing of any supplies, materials, equipment and services other than personal services for any amount not more than such sum set forth in sub-division (c)(1) of this section. The County Executive shall execute all other contracts on behalf of the e<u>C</u>ounty as provided by Section 2202 of Article 22 of the e<u>C</u>harter;
- (8) $p\underline{P}$ erform, under the direction of the County Executive, all other duties of a county purchasing agent under the laws of the State of New York, not inconsistent with the provisions of this $e\underline{C}$ ode;
- (9) <u>pP</u>repare procedural regulations to amplify the provisions of this section and submit such regulations to the County Executive for approval and upon such approval, promulgate and enforce compliance with such regulations.

(c) Purchasing Procedure.

- (1) The $\underline{d}\underline{D}$ ivision of $\underline{p}\underline{P}$ urchase shall make all purchases of and contract for supplies, materials, equipment and services for the $\underline{e}\underline{C}$ ounty, the Board of County Legislators or any administrative unit for the payment of which the $\underline{e}\underline{C}$ ounty shall be liable. Any such purchase or contract of purchase involving an expenditure of the amount set forth in Section 103, subdivision (1) of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York, as amended, shall be made after advertisement in an official daily newspaper printed in the English language and published in the County of Oneida, and having a general circulation in the County of Oneida, which advertisement shall invite sealed bids for the same. The purchase of perishable foodstuffs, drugs and medical supplies, may be made without public advertisement when expressly permitted by written order of the County Executive.
- (2) Such advertisement shall contain a statement of the time when and the place where all bids received pursuant to such notice will be publicly opened and read. At least five (5) days shall elapse between the first publication of such advertisement and the date specified therein for the opening and reading of bids. The pPurchasing dDirector, or the person designated by him to open the bids at the time and place specified, shall make a record of such bids in such form and detail as the Purchasing Director shall prescribe. The contract shall be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder furnishing the required security, if any, after advertisement for sealed bids in the manner provided by this section. In cases where two or more responsible bidders furnishing the required security, if any, and submit identical bid as to price, the pPurchasing dDirector may award the contract to any of such bidders. The pPurchasing dDirector may, in his discretion, reject all bids and re-advertise for new bids in the manner provided by this section.
- (3) The $p\underline{P}$ urchasing $d\underline{D}$ irector may purchase supplies, materials, equipment or services to be rendered by contract without the advertisement required by paragraphs (1) and (2) of this section subsection (c) herein in the following cases:
 - $(\underline{i}a)$ $\underline{w}\underline{W}$ hen the County Executive has declared a public emergency arising out of an accident or other unforeseen occurrence or condition whereby circumstances

- affecting the life, health, or safety of inhabitants of the County of Oneida require immediate action which cannot await competitive bidding;
- (<u>iib</u>) <u>w</u><u>W</u>hen, by resolution adopted by a vote of at least two-thirds (2/3) of the whole number, the Board of County Legislators has determined it to be impracticable to advertise for such bids;
- (iiie) wWhen through some accident or other unforeseen circumstances the heating, air-conditioning, ventilating, lighting, plumbing system, machinery, equipment or other apparatus of any of the public buildings of the county shall become disabled or any of such buildings or parts thereof shall be rendered untenable by reason of the sudden action of the elements or for some cause due to explosion or fire or from generally unforeseeable events creating an emergency, and the administrative head in charge of such building shall certify in writing to the purchasing director such emergency and the necessity of immediate repair to the defect or defects, and such certificate of necessity is approved by the County Executive; or
- (<u>iv</u>d) <u>w</u><u>W</u>henever the machinery, equipment or other apparatus of the $d\underline{D}$ epartment of $p\underline{P}$ ublic <u>w</u> <u>W</u>orks or of the $d\underline{D}$ epartment of $s\underline{S}$ olid <u>w</u> <u>W</u>aste <u>m</u> <u>M</u> anagement becomes disabled or worn and requires immediate repair, making necessary the immediate purchase of parts for repairs to the same, the Commissioner of Public Works or the <u>e</u> <u>C</u> ommissioner of $s\underline{S}$ olid <u>w</u> <u>W</u> aste <u>m</u> <u>M</u> anagement, as the case may be, shall certify in writing to the director of purchasing of the necessity of such immediate repair and/or replacement, and such certificate of necessity is approved by the County Executive.
- (4) Upon the adoption of a resolution by a vote of at least two-thirds (2/3) of the whole number of the Board of County Legislators stating that, for reasons of efficiency and economy, there is need for standardization, purchase contracts for a particular type of or kind of equipment, material or services in excess of the amount fixed by the Board of County Legislators pursuant to paragraph (c)(1) of this section may be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder furnishing the required security, if any, after advertisement for sealed bids therefor in the manner provided by this section. Such resolution shall contain a full explanation of the reasons for its adoption.
- (5) All required supplies which can be furnished by the setate $\underline{d}\underline{D}$ epartment of ecorrection, and all required products made by the blind which can be furnished by any appropriate charitable non-profit making agency for the blind, incorporated under the laws of the State of New York, shall, after such purchases have been authorized, be purchased from them without competitive bidding at prices established pursuant to Section 175-a of the State Finance Law. In addition, the perchasing decorrection may, without the competitive bidding herein before required, make purchases of supplies, materials or equipment, except printed materials, through the setate of general services, subject to such rules and regulations as may be established pursuant to section one hundred sixty-three of the State Finance Law or other applicable law.
- (6) Surplus and second-hand supplies, materials or equipment may be purchased without competitive bidding from the Federal government, the State of New York or from any other political subdivision or district.

- (7) Except as otherwise specifically provided, no supplies, materials or equipment shall be delivered except as specifically ordered by the $d\underline{\mathbf{D}}$ ivision of $p\underline{\mathbf{P}}$ urchase. No supplies, materials or equipment shall be delivered by such division to any administrative unit, officer or employee except upon a requisition in writing.
- (8) The Comptroller shall not audit any bill for supplies, materials, equipment or services unless it shall fully appear that such items or services were ordered by the $p\underline{P}$ urchasing $d\underline{D}$ irector and the $p\underline{P}$ urchasing $d\underline{D}$ irector has certified the prices at which he made the purchases. All requisitions received by the $p\underline{P}$ urchasing $d\underline{D}$ irector shall be filed in his office and open to public inspection under reasonable regulations for their safety and preservation. The $p\underline{P}$ urchasing $d\underline{D}$ irector shall make no purchases until he has first secured the certification of the Comptroller that there are unencumbered balances available for the purpose.
- (9) No bid for materials, supplies, equipment or services may be accepted from or contract therefor awarded to any person who is in arrears in taxes or upon debt or contract to or with the e $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$ ounty or who has defaulted as surety or otherwise upon a contract or obligation to the e $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$ ounty, or who may be otherwise disqualified under any act of the legislature not inconsistent with the e $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$ harter or $\underline{\mathbf{this}}$ e $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$ ode.

(d) Mail Services

(1) The Purchasing Director shall establish mailing services for all County Departments utilizing the services of the United States Postal Services and any other 3rd party carrier that can provide cost effective delivery services to administrative units. Additionally, the Mail Services shall process and deliver all inter-office mail by means of a dedicated County Mail Courier.

(e) Printing and Duplication Services

- (1) The Purchasing Director shall establish and maintain printing, duplication and bindery services for all administrative units, and can extend those services to other local governments within Oneida County, as well as not-for-profit agencies within Oneida County.
- 2. That Article III, Section 306.1 of the Oneida County Administrative Code shall be amended by the deletion of all matters that are stricken and the addition of all matters in **bold and underlined** as set forth below:

<u>Section 306.1. Bureau of Weights and Measures.</u> The Bureau of Weights and Measures shall be headed by the County Director of Weights and Measures. He shall possess all of the qualifications required for, and shall have all the powers and duties of, a county director of weights and measures now or hereafter granted or imposed by Article 16 of the Agriculture and Markets Law of the State of New York, local law, ordinance or resolution of the Board of <u>County</u> Legislators, order or direction of the County Executive, or <u>Purchasing Director</u>, and any

applicable provision of any act of the legislature not inconsistent with the e $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$ harter or $\underline{\mathbf{this}}$ e $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$ ode.

- <u>(a)</u> Whenever the e<u>C</u>ounty d<u>D</u>irector of w<u>W</u>eights and m<u>M</u>easures is required by any s<u>S</u>tate law to make a report, he shall, at the same time, file a written copy thereof with the <u>Purchasing Director County Executive</u> and the Board of <u>County Legislators</u>.
- (b) The e $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$ ounty d $\underline{\mathbf{D}}$ irector of w $\underline{\mathbf{W}}$ eights and m $\underline{\mathbf{M}}$ easures shall be appointed by the County Executive, subject to confirmation by the Board of $\underline{\mathbf{County}}$ Legislators.
- 3. That Article III, Section 307 of the Oneida County Administrative Code shall be amended by the deletion of all matters that are stricken and the addition of all matters in **bold and underlined** as set forth below:

Section 307. Division of Central Services Information Technology.

- (a) The <u>Information Technology</u> Director of <u>Central Services</u> shall be the head of the d<u>D</u>ivision of <u>Central Services</u> <u>Information Technology</u> and shall have the powers and duties set forth in Section 307 of Article 3 of the e<u>C</u>harter. He shall, in addition to his powers and duties set forth in the e<u>C</u>harter or <u>this</u> e<u>C</u>ode, perform such other and related duties as the County Executive may require.
- (b) The Central Services Information Technology Director shall, under the supervision and direction of the County Executive, organize the divisions of Information Technology, Mail Services, Print Shop, and such other divisions as may be authorized by the Board of County Legislators.
- (c) The Director of Central Services, and such deputies and other employees of the division of central services as are required by the County Executive shall each give a surety bond to the county in a sum fixed by the Board of County Legislators conditioned for the faithful performance of his duties. Such bond shall be approved as to form by the County Attorney and as to the sufficiency of surety by the County Executive and filed with the Department of Records.
- (cd) The Central Services Information Technology Director shall be the Chief Information Security Officer of the County. He shall establish, maintain and supervise such facilities for information technology systems and infrastructure mailing, printing and reproduction as may be provided by the Board of County Legislators; and establish, maintain and supervise such other central service facilities as may be established by direction of the County Executive, within the appropriations provided therefor.
- (e1) Information Technology (i) The Central Services Information Technology Director shall establish, maintain and support a secure and scalable County government-wide area telecommunications network, providing network connectivity to all administrative units as well as providing data file storage, Internet, email access as well as access to any other shared data

program or application <u>and mobile devices</u> required by that department in the performance of its official duties.

(2) Mail Services

(i) The Central Services Director shall establish mailing services for all County Departments utilizing the services of the United States Postal Services and any other 3rd party carrier that can provide cost effective delivery services to administrative units. Additionally, the Mail Services shall process and deliver all inter-office mail by means of a dedicated County Mail Courier.

(3) Printing and Duplication Services

(i) The Central Services Director shall establish and maintain printing, duplication and bindery services for all administrative units, and can extend those services to other local governments within Oneida County, as well as not-for-profit agencies within Oneida County.

(4) Central Stores

- (a) The Director of Central Services shall establish and maintain the Bureau of Central Stores and shall disburse and transfer supplies, materials and equipment in his custody among the administrative units upon receipt of properly executed order from those administrative units. The accounts of Central Stores shall be audited by the Comptroller of Oneida County at any time deemed so appropriate by the Comptroller.
- (b) No disbursement and transfer of supplies, materials and equipment under its custody shall be made by the Bureau of Central Stores, mailing, printing and reproduction to any administrative unit except upon receipt by such bureau of properly executed order from the division of purchase for such disbursement and transfer. For the purpose of this section, an order shall be deemed to be properly executed when a requisition signed by the administrative unit head or by such employees as he shall designate has been received by the division of purchase and such division has secured the certification of the Comptroller that there are unencumbered balances of said administrative unit available for the purchase of supplies, materials and equipment, mas the case may be. And such requisition and certification has been signed by the purchasing director or by an employee authorized to sign the same.
- 4. This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State in accordance with Sections 20, 21 and 27 of the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law.

A LOCAL LAW TO OVERRIDE THE TAX LEVY LIMIT ESTABLISHED IN GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW \S 3-c

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY LEGISLATORS OF THE COUNTY OF ONEIDA, STATE OF NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

1. Legislative Intent

It is the intent of the Board of County Legislators of County of Oneida, by enactment of this Local Law, to override the limit on the amount of real property taxes that may be levied by the County of Oneida pursuant to General Municipal Law § 3-c, and to allow the County of Oneida to adopt a county budget for the fiscal year 2019 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by General Municipal Law § 3-c.

2. Authority

This Local Law is adopted pursuant to General Municipal Law § 3-c(5), which expressly authorizes the Board of County Legislators to override the tax levy limit by adoption of a local law approved by a vote of sixty percent (60%) of the total voting power of the Board.

3. Tax Levy Limit Override

The Board of County Legislators of the County of Oneida is hereby authorized to adopt a budget for the fiscal year 2019 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the limit specified in General Municipal Law § 3-c.

4. **Effective Date**

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State in accordance with Sections 20, 21 and 27 of the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING \$694,000 BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF ONEIDA, NEW YORK, TO PAY THE COST OF THE PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF PHONE SYSTEM UPGRADES FOR THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE AND E911 CENTER IN AND FOR SAID COUNTY. (H582)

BE IT RESOLVED, by the County Legislature of the County of Oneida, New York, as follows:

- Section 1. The purchase and installation of phone system upgrades for the Sheriff's Office and E911 Center, including incidental expenses in connection therewith, is hereby authorized at a maximum estimated cost of \$694,000.
- Section 2. The maximum estimated cost of such object or purpose is \$694,000 and the plan for the financing thereof shall be by the issuance of the \$694,000 bonds of said County herein authorized.
- Section 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes is ten years, pursuant to subdivision 25 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.
- Section 4. The faith and credit of said County of Oneida, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. There shall be annually apportioned and assessed upon the several lots and parcels of land within said District, in the manner provided by law, an amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest on said bonds as the same become due, but if not paid from such source, all the taxable real property in said County shall be subject to the levy of ad valorem taxes sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same shall become due.
- Section 5. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the County Comptroller, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said County Comptroller, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.
- Section 6. All other matters except as provided herein relating to the bonds herein authorized including the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same, including the consolidation with other issues, and also the ability to issue bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, shall be determined by the County Comptroller, the chief fiscal officer of such County. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the County Comptroller shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 7. In anticipation of the issuance of such obligations, available funds of the County may be advanced for such object or purpose.

<u>Section 8.</u> The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said County is not authorized to expend money, or
- The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
- 3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.
- Section 9. This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.
- <u>Section 10.</u> This resolution, which takes effect immediately, shall be published in summary form in the official newspapers of such County, together with a notice of the Clerk of the County Legislature in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.
