- WHEREAS, Oneida County Executive, Anthony J. Picente, Jr., is in receipt of correspondence from Oneida County Clerk, Sandra J. DePerno, advising that the allowances presently received by the County Clerk's Office do not adequately compensate for the collection of such tax, and
