Additionally, it has been discovered that substantial inflow and infiltration in the Starch Factory Creek Interceptor Sewer (which serves East Utica and along with portions of the Towns of New Hartford and Frankfort) and North Utica Interceptor Sewer (which serves the towns of Deerfield, Marcy, and Schuyler along with North Utica and the Village of Holland Patent) is significant during severe wet weather and negatively impacts WPCP operations. Therefore, a supplementary phase of collection system evaluation and rehabilitation is warranted to further identify and reduce inflow and infiltration, and
- WHEREAS, The New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation (NYSEFC) has determined that Oneida County is eligible to receive a combination of Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) grant and interest-free/subsidized financing for the supplemental collection system rehabilitation project.
