

RE: MEMORIALIZING A REQUEST TO THE STATE LEGISLATORS REPRESENTING ONEIDA COUNTY TO SECURE THE PASSAGE OF SENATE BILL NO. S6023 AND ASSEMBLY BILL NO. A6631 WHICH WOULD EXTEND AUTHORIZATION FOR ONEIDA COUNTY TO IMPOSE ADDITIONAL RATES OF SALES AND COMPENSATING USE TAXES AND PROVIDE FOR ALLOCATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF A PORTION OF NET COLLECTIONS FROM SUCH ADDITIONAL RATES.

WHEREAS, the County of Oneida continues to face challenges in its annual budgets attributable to recent state mandated payments and accounting procedures and despite a state imposed cap on Medicaid costs, which contained, but did not decrease, the Medicaid burden on counties, and

WHEREAS, in light of these challenges, this Board desires to continue the Administration's policy of not placing the gross impact of county costs on the county real property owners, and

WHEREAS, the sales tax is a regressive tax for which all residents and non-residents comply, and

WHEREAS, additionally, the County wishes to protect its credit rating and promote the stability and viability of future annual budgets while continuing to impose spending restrictions, consolidate services and reduce the workforce in areas that the loss of workers will not compromise or endanger the delivery of necessary County services, now, therefore, be it hereby

RESOLVED, that the Oneida County Board of Legislators sends a Home Rule Request to our local representatives in the New York State Senate and the New York State Assembly urging the passage of Senate Bill No. S6023 and Assembly Bill No. A6631 permitting Oneida County to impose an additional one percent rate of sales and compensating use taxes for the period beginning December 1, 2023, and ending November 30, 2025; impose a second additional sales and compensating use tax rate of either three quarters of one percent or one-half of one percent for the same period; and to distribute a portion of the net collections from the additional one percent rate, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Oneida County Board of Legislators urges Senator Joseph A. Griffo to enact Senate Bill No. S6023 and urges Assemblywoman Marianne Buttenschon and Assemblymen Brian D. Miller, Ken Blankenbush and Robert Smullen to enact Assembly Bill No. A6631 that would permit Oneida County to impose an additional one percent rate of sales and compensating use taxes for the period beginning December 1, 2023, and ending November 30, 2025; impose a second additional sales and compensating use tax rate of either three quarters of one percent or one-half of one percent for the same period; and to distribute a portion of the net collections from the additional one percent rate, and be it further

During the process of preparing for the closing of the County's accounting records for 2022, deficit balances were identified in a number of employee fringe benefit accounts that will require transfers. The transfers are covered by surplus funds in the 2022 budgets of other related fringe accounts.

Health Insurance shortages result from an evolving workforce and coverage changes that they may elect. The shortages in the retirement accounts are due to the ever-increasing NYS Retirement charge and the decision to pay off the entire retirement liability in order to save on interest charges.

Due to the need to close the 2022 accounting records, I ask that these transfers be acted upon at the **May 10th meeting.** I therefore request your Board approval for the following **2022** fund transfers:

JUDICIARY LAW SECTION 321 TO PROVIDE THE ONEIDA COUNTY DISTRICT ATTORNEY WITH AUTHORITY TO APPOINT FIVE (5) STENOGRAPHERS TO TAKE TESTIMONY GIVEN BEFORE THE GRAND JURY

WHEREAS, the discovery reforms enacted by the New York State legislature have increased and accelerated the requirements on the District Attorney relative to the provision of the minutes from the grand jury to defense counsel, which has created a significant strain on the resources of the District Attorney's office, and
