Oneida County Transportation Report

 Mark Laramie gave a presentation on the transportation projects and investments made by Oneida County for the past year. Mark highlighted the funding challenges that the COVID-19 Pandemic caused.

The total amount of funding expended on highway improvement projects for 2020 was \$3,500,000. There were 23 projects that covered approximately 34 linear miles of roadway. Of those projects, one was a Micro Pave project, one was a Nova Chip with Micro Milling project, five were Mill and Fill projects, and 16 of those were Hot Top Paving projects.

\$1.5 million dollars was expended on bridge and structure improvement projects. There were four projects, of which, one was a bridge deck replacement, and three were structure replacements.

The Marcy – SUNYIT Parkway reconstruction has a design in progress with an estimated cost of \$7 million. The letting and construction schedule of that project will commence in 2021.

Concerning locally administered Federal and/or State Aid projects, the reconstruction of Middle Settlement Road in the Town of New Hartford is currently being designed with an estimated cost of \$5,422,000. Additionally, the replacement of three arch bridges in the Towns of Annsville, Steuben, and Lee is currently being designed with a total cost estimate of \$1,584,000. The letting and construction of that project will commence in 2021.

There are some projects that are owned/funded by the respective Towns while being sponsored/administered by Oneida County. These projects include: the rehabilitation of Mill Street Bridge over Fish Creek in the Town of Camden for \$1,178,822, the replacement of Horton Road Bridge over Woodhull Creek in the Town of Forestport for \$1,487,200, the replacement of the Clinton Street Bridge over Sauquoit Creek in the Town of New Hartford for \$3,958,000, and the replacement of the Oneida Street Bridge over Sauquoit Creek in the Town of Paris for \$1,600,000. The Clinton Street Bridge project is currently underfunded but the County is targeting future Bridge NY programs as an additional funding source. The Oneida Street Bridge project is also underfunded but the County will allocate additional Local Block funds in order to complete.

Herkimer County Transportation Report

• Mark Nagele gave a presentation on behalf of the Herkimer County Highways Department for projects undertaken for the past year.

There were many storm damage emergency highway repairs undertaken due to the October 2019 floods. These projects included: Dairy Hill Road roadway reconstruction in the Town of Salisbury (\$610,213.30 of FEMA and CHIPS funding), Black Creek Road Bridge Replacement in the Town of Norway (\$468,856.70 of CHIPS funding), Military Road culvert deck replacement in the Town of Russia (\$271,416.19 of CHIPS funding), highway rehabilitation of Ohio City Road and Church Street in the Town of Ohio (\$437,829.37 in PAVE NY funding), roadside bank armoring on Bush Road in the Town of Schuyler (\$82,268.06 in FEMA and CHIPS funding), a bridge replacement on Gray Wilmurt Road in the Town of Norway (\$842,630.43 in FEMA, CHIPS, and EWR funding), bank stabilization on White Creek Road in the Town of Newport (\$299,999.00 in FEMA and CHIPS funding), creek bank armoring along Emmonsburg Road in the Town of Salisbury (\$296,000.00 in FEMA and CHIPS funding), general countywide storm and flood damage repairs (\$600,000 in FEMA and county emergency funds), and emergency countywide pavement repairs (\$383,599.55 in FEMA and EWR funds).

Other projects undertaken by the department included: highway resurfacing of Chepachet Road in the Town of Winfield (\$253,747.85 in PaveNY funding), relining of a large culvert on Summit Road and Newport Road in the Towns of Newport and Schuyler (\$442,434.00 in CHIPS funding).

NYSDOT Region 2 Report

Deb Windecker gave a report on the activities that NYSDOT Region 2 has performed in the last quarter. The following projects were let during the time period: Traffic Signal Improvement Project 19 was awarded to Powerline – Construction for \$1.057M, Route 28/Forestport Reservoir & CR 72 had Luck Brothers as the apparent low bidder at \$2.12M, Overhead Sign Structure – 20' had Elderlee as the apparent low bidder at \$996,000, and the Route 8 Bridge Replacement at Route 5, 8, and 12 Interchange had the apparent low bidder among nine bidders as Bette/Cring, LLC at \$11.85M.

The Higginsville Bridge was opened on November 10 after ten years of being closed. Richfield Street in the Town of German Flatts was also recently opened after being awarded funding through BRIDGENY. All of the projects in the 2016 round of BRIDGENY have been completed.

The 5s Safety Project will have the roundabout opened on the week of December 13. The project is scheduled to be substantially complete by the end of the year with follow-up landscaping items to be completed next spring. The Bagg's Square Pedestrian Way project is also nearing completion.

The paving projects on Routes 12 and 49 have been completed. Bridge painting on the Route 51 Washington Street Bridge in Herkimer County has also been completed.

Upcoming projects to be let include: Paving Improvement on State Route 51 let under a VPP/OGS contract on December 10, Paving Improvement on State Route 12 from State Route 8 to Putnam Road/Trenton Road Intersection also let under a VPP/OGS contract on December 10, and the Village of Mohawk Paving and Signal Upgrades which will be let in January.

NYSDOT received an announcement late last week that the 2020 Marchiselli funds that were applied for have been approved. These funds are used in projects when there is a federal match of 80% and the remaining 20% is locally matched. Marchiselli funds is a state funding source that will subsidize the local cost of a project for a total of 15%. Region 2 had \$910,000 with around \$600,000 for use in Oneida County.

NYSDOT has been working with HOCTS to get an RFP prepared for a Planning and Environmental Linkages Study on the Thruway Exit 31 Interchange in Utica. It is anticipated that the scope of work will be developed in January 2021 with a planned release in Spring 2021. HOCTS has allocated \$100,000 to such a study and NYSDOT has secured \$300,000 in statewide planning research funds.

A Bridge NY Round 3 was discussed to be included in the NYS Budget, Region 2 anticipates that another round of solicitation within the next year.
