Public Comment

Director's Report

- o HOCTC Director, Dana Crisino gave a synopsis of current and past quarter HOCTC activities:
 - Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) safety action plan grant, a collaboration between Oneida County, Herkimer County, and the MPO, has been awarded by USDOT the full amount of \$520,000 inclusive of all the matches. The grant will assist in providing a base-level analysis of safety on the local roadway network. The plan will identify problem areas and use best practices to mitigate them. Once the plan is in place, funding for capital improvements will be available to apply for in future funding rounds. A scope of work related to an RFP seeking professional planning services for the program will go out by the next meeting. The study has a 10-14-month timeline to position HOCTC to seek capital funding in the 2024 funding round.
 - Notice was provided in December that the 2023 2027 Transportation Improvement Plan was approved alongside a roll-up into the STIP. Action needs to be taken on items contained in the previous TIP to incorporate them into this current TIP, which is on the

- agenda for this meeting. A brief presentation on the new HOCTC TIP Data Viewer was provided, showing the digital map and information on the website.
- The Exit 31 Planning and Environmental Linkages (PEL) Study Request for Proposal (RFP) is currently out and active as of January 12, and it is open through the end of February. Dana is expecting 8 to 10 proposals to be submitted. \$700,000 in SPR funds was secured and the MPO has \$100,000 to pitch in for \$800,000 total. The study's timeline will be 22 months to determine the feasibility of redesigning the Exit 31 interchange and how it interacts with all the local roadways around it. Dana has stated she has received significant inquiries so far from interested parties and is expecting a very good response from consultants.
- The Local Transportation Planning Assistance Program (LTPAP) is in-progress. Julie Richmond, Transportation Program Manager, is coordinating the projects directly. The LTPAP projects are safety and complete streets studies for Kellogg Road in New Harford and Chestnut Street in Rome. The anticipated timeline for completion is September 2023.
- Public workshops will be held next Tuesday evening, February 28, 2023, in the Town of New Hartford and on March 8, 2023, for West Chestnut Street in Rome.
- The Section 5311 Rural Operating Assistance application for Mobility Management in Oneida County has been submitted to NYSDOT and the MPO is now waiting for award notification.

NYSDOT Region 2 Report

- o Deborah Windecker gave the following report on behalf of NYSDOT Region 2:
 - Christina Tancredi, NYSDOT Transportation Analyst, is a new staff person in the department and is in a traineeship program.
 - Deborah Windecker reported on the activities that NYSDOT Region 2 has performed in the last quarter.
 - The transportation legislative hearings were initiated at NYS. The governor's proposed budget is proposing level funding of CHIPS at \$578 million alongside \$150 million for PAVE NY, and \$100 million for Pave Our Potholes, which was new for 2022.
 - There is \$600 million allocated for the BRIDGE NY program and submitted applications are currently being reviewed by review teams across the state. Project awards are anticipated in April 2023. Resolutions will be made at the next GP&L meeting for local project awards. There is still more funding that will be made available in the next year and a half for the next round.
 - Last week, \$100 million was announced for the Highway Renewal Program. The Mohawk Valley was awarded \$6.5 million, with \$1.2 million for 5 miles of pavement rehab on Route 167 from Route 168 to the Monastery, and \$1.4 million from Route 5s in the Town of German Flatts to Route 28 where it meets the Mohawk Station.
 - A lot of funding is being made available in discretionary programs. On February 8, a webinar was hosted by USDOT regarding how to apply for USDOT grants, which include programs such as buses and bus facilities, low or no-emission vehicles, charging and fueling infrastructure, Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative Efficient and Cost Saving Transportation (PROTECT), Safe Streets 4 All, Ferry Programs, Transit-Oriented Development Pilot, Multimodal Project Discretionary grant opportunities, Thriving Communities, Reconnecting Communities Program and Neighborhood Access and Equity Grant Program, FAST-SAF/FAST-Tech, Bridge

- Investment Program, Railroad Crossing Elimination, Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvements Grant, and Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation (SMART) Grants.
- NYSDOT applied for the SMART Grant program in November to look at adaptive signals on the Commercial Drive corridor in the amount of \$2 million. Region 2 is also applying for a rural planning grant for RAISE, this will look at the Burrstone/Champlin/French area, it is a high-priority investigation location for a few years and needs to be addressed. The planning funds would also include design funds. This will be submitted by February 28, 2023.
- Funding levels have increased for the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP.) A Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) will be out by Spring. NYSDOT staff will be coordinating outreach to local municipalities prior to its release.
- The Route 5s over Nowadaga Creek has been let and awarded \$4.1 million to ING Construction. An offsite detour will be provided. NYSDOT staff worked with Mark Nagele, Herkimer County Highways Department Superintendent, to coordinate the closure of the creek road adjacent to the bridge for 4 -5 weeks during the project.
- Upcoming projects for the 2023 construction season include:
 - Four bridges along the Route 5/8/12 corridor will have bridge preservation repair work done with single-lane travel starting May 1, 2023, and ending in October. The exit ramp onto French Road will remain open but the entrance ramp to get onto French Road across from Home Depot will be closed. Traffic will be routed up French Road to Burrstone Road to get onto Route 5/8/12. It is a \$5.6 million project with Slate Hill as the contractor.
 - An additional project will also be the pavement reconstruction of Champlin Avenue in Yorkville, including Complete Streets concepts, ADA ramps, sidewalks, signal, and intersection improvements. This project is funded at \$3.1 million with a \$650,000 investment from the Mohawk Valley Water Authority (MVWA) for waterline betterment. The project was awarded to Rifenburg.
 - Pavement rehabilitation on Genesee Street in the Village of New Hartford for \$7.9 million. The project will include a \$3 million waterline betterment from the Mohawk Valley Water Authority (MVWA) which is partnering on this project. Project limits are along Genesee Street (NYS Route 921E) from the intersection with NYS Route 12 to the village line, and, along Campion Road, Oxford Road, and Mill Street (NYS Route 921T) from the New Hartford Shopping Center driveway to the connection with NYS Route 8 Southbound. This 1.7-mile pavement rehabilitation and the complete street project include sidewalk upgrades, ADA ramps, and new traffic signals with enhanced pedestrian accommodations. The project was awarded to CCI Contractor for \$7.986 million and will take approximately two years.
 - An 11-mile pavement resurfacing and guide rail/sign upgrades will commence this construction season on Route 8 from the Village of Cold Brook to West Canada Creek. The project was let, and the low bidder was Heidelberg Materials which is programmed for \$12 million.
- John Piseck mentioned, regarding BRIDGE NY, that the City of Little Falls had applied for a small bridge grant. He asked if there is anything additional that the committee can do. Deborah Windecker stated that the applications have been received and are currently

being reviewed by the bridge review team. She also stated that there would be a regional and local review team in this review round.

• New York State Thruway Authority Report

- o Sara Sherlock, NYSTA Assistant Engineer, gave the following report on behalf of NYSTA:
 - The Judd Road bridge project is ongoing, completion is set for Spring/early Summer.
 - The Millers Grove bridge project is set to have the eastbound portion replaced this year with a completion date of fall 2023.
 - In the process of coordinating with NYSDOT for comments on Main Street in Herkimer near the exit.
 - Chairman, Anthony Picente asked if any changes or progress have been made with the Judd Road bridge. Sara stated that construction is anticipated to start in March with no changes since the last discussion of the project. The materials are on track for the project.

• Open Forum for Committee Discussion

- Vice-Chairperson Vincent Bono voiced concern in light of what has recently happened in Ohio regarding the train wreck. He asked what is the Herkimer and Oneida County plan or recourse for a potential event? Who takes responsibility? Is there a clearing house for who takes responsibility for the inspections and maintenance of Conrail bridges? Is there a mechanism for what the HOCTC committee can do?
 - Chairperson Anthony Picente stated that 70 80 trains a day travel through the two-county area. Several years ago, Oneida County did a tabletop exercise for a train derailment crash scenario. He said it may be prudent to do a new one in the future coordinating with Herkimer County and Emergency Services. It was agreed that a joint letter to CSX may be warranted. It was also noted that CSX is deficient in responsibilities in dealing with culverts, flooding, and other areas that are not rail. They don't care about anything else except for clearing the track. The joint county effort will

work with federal officials on coordinating a response. Chairperson Anthony Picente stated he will work with Vice-Chairperson Vincent Bono on this issue.

- John Piseck asked if anything has been done regarding raising that portion of the Route 5s project to prevent flooding. Deborah Windecker stated that would only be preventative paving and is minimal; raising it will not address those concerns. John Piseck asked who can address those concerns. Linda Lubey stated that it is a long-range planning effort that would involve environmental efforts.
- Christian Mercurio, Mohawk Valley EDGE stated he would like to support Chairman Picente in the county's work on the redevelopment of the triangle parcel to be a premier semiconductor supply chain campus of the northeast. Adjacent to that, there is a redesign effort to close the pedestrian gap to connect the 4 miles of Griffiss Sculpture Park trail to the Mohawk River Trail. Christian Mercurio stated he would like to see it get done. Deborah Windecker stated she will seek out the NOFA for TAP in the Spring and will reach out to Matthew Andrews. In Oriskany, there is some significant momentum being gained at the intersection of Route 69 and River Street on revitalizing the property adjacent. Christian would like to start talking with the county and NYSDOT on the next steps since NYSDOT is doing work on crosswalks there. Lastly, MV EDGE is working with the county on positioning Chevron Road for additional development. At the intersection of River Road and Chevron Road, there is big work going on. He also stated he needs help approaching Mohawk, Adirondack, and Northern Railroad to assist in that site.
- Linda Lubey stated that economic development is great and that the quality of life is preserved. It is prudent to stay up front and talk about things early.
